Purpose

- □ To explain and provide documentation of the economic conditions since 2008 that have resulted in conditions of high poverty and therefore an increasing need and demand for food stamps.
- To explain conditions in Texas regarding utilizing and administering the federal SNAP food stamp program administered by Texas Dept. Human Services.
- □ To explain the widening wealth gap between rich and poor, and inability of the middle class to increase it share of wealth even with education and hard work.

Both poverty and family incomes have been declining consistently for decades verifying the adage "rich get richer and poor get poorer".

WASHINGTON — The recent economic crisis left the median U.S. family in 2010 with no more wealth than in the early 1990s, erasing almost two decades of accumulated prosperity, the Federal Reserve said Monday. A hypothetical family richer than half the nation's families and poorer than the other half had a net worth of \$77,300 in 2010, compared with \$126,400 in 2007, the Fed said. The crash of housing prices directly accounted for three-quarters of the loss.

Families' income also continued to decline, a trend that predated the crisis but accelerated over the same period. Median family income fell to \$45,800 in 2010 from \$49,600 in 2007. All figures were adjusted for inflation.

The new data comes from the Fed's release Monday of its Survey of Consumer Finances, a





More than 43 million Americans lived in poverty last year, the largest number in 51 years, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

The figure pushes the national poverty rate to 14.3 percent, up from 13.2 percent in 2008, statistics released Thursday show.

In Texas, there were about 4.3 million people living in poverty in 2009, increasing the state's poverty rate to 17.3 percent, up from 15.9 percent the prior year.

PERCENTAGE OF BENEFIT RECIPIENTS BY LEVEL OF EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT






Pre-tax household income Growth of the Wealth Gap since 1980 and Decline of





Houston had a respectable showing on the Forbes magazine annual ranking of the world's billionaires, even as half of the local billionaires were a bit lighter in the pocket with the drop in oil prices.

Pipeline magnate Richard Kinder cracked into the Top 100 with \$12 billion in net worth after Some of the city's billionaires ranked by Forbes have a little less money because of the plunge in crude oil prices

Dannine Avara, Scott Duncan and Milane Frantz, three of the heirs of the late Dan Duncan who also gained wealth through pipelines, shared the No. 230 spot with \$6.2 billion each in net worth, down \$100 million from of Hilcorp, saw his net worth fall by \$600 million to \$4.9 billion, which earned him a ranking of 318. George Bishop, the founder of GeoSouthern Energy, erased \$800 million of his net worth from the previous year for a total Texas ranch to Shell Oil in 2010, according to Forbes.

Richard Kinder was joined by five other Houstonians who added to their net worth in 2015.

After Kinder, Dan Friedkin of Gulf States Toyota added the most to his net wealth — \$800 million — bringing him in at No.534 with \$3.3 billion.







A growing crisis greets Labor Day

Frustration is boiling over, expert says, with low wages, sense of inequality

It was mostly janitors and fast-food and other low-wage workers on the front lines last week protesting their pay, but the movement for a "livable" broader swath of Americans who lost ground during the recent recession.

"We're in a situation where a quarter of Americans are earning poverty wages," said Arne L. Kalleberg, author of "Good Jobs, Bad Jobs." For a family of four, that's a little less than \$24,000 a year.

The rallies across the nation last week focused on boosting wages to \$15 an hour, which is more than double the federal minimum of \$7.25.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics predicts that in the next decade, seven out of 10 of the fastest-growing jobs will be in low-wage industries such as fast food, personal services and retail, said Kalleberg, a sociology professor at the University of North Carolina.


Middle-income jobs such as manufacturing, clerical and administrative roles are not growing as quickly. "Lots of folks are working hard and not getting anywhere," he said. "Frustration is boiling over."

That growing sense of polarization gave rise to the notso-distant Occupy Wall Street movement that spread around the country. While the rallies have stopped, the rallying cry

Current Value & Variable Buying Power of the Minimum Wage


Obama's objective in the 2013 State of the Union speech was to index minimum wage to the CPI so wages grow consistent with inflation. Inflation erodes the purchasing value of a dollar such that increases in wages are always needed. Minimum wage value in the 1960s had greater buying power than today (\$10.56 vs. \$7.25 today), thus the middle class is in worse economic condition now than 40 years ago.



- □ The actual dollar amount of the minimum wage is higher now (\$7.25) than in history, but its buying power in 2013 is less than 1960s due to inflation when its value was \$10.56
- Obama advocates raising minimum wage to \$9. in his 2013 State of the Union speech which still is below 1968 levels.

CNNMoney, however, has <u>debunked the myth that raising</u> the minimum wage in America is the only element necessary to raise a family out of poverty. For a family of four making at least \$9/hr., and while taking advantage of several key tax breaks, CNNMoney writes that the new rate would be barely enough to lift the family above the poverty line, and hardly enough to raise their standard of living by much in light of the US's dependence on a tax code that has been decried as "broken" by many.

While raising the minimum wage would be a step in the right direction towards addressing poverty in the US, advocates for economic justice argue that helping people find higher-paying jobs is another, more effective, means of fighting poverty.







VETOED FAIR PAY ACT FOR TEXAS WOMEN

Texas Governor Rick Perry has some bad news for Texas women. Perry called legislators that Texas would not join the federal government and 42 other states that have addressed gender-based wage discrimination. Their bill, which installs state-level legal protections similar to those enacted by the federal Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act of 2009, had a lot of momentum before reaching Perry's desk. Last month the Itegislation, along with two separate amendments, cleared both of the state's chambers, and it would have made Texas the 43rd state in the Union to have passed such legislation.



State Senator Sylvia Garcia, D-Houston, cancels her appearance at Macy's to promote Tax Free Weekend. The liberal group Progress Texas started an online boycott of Macy's and Kroger, asking folks to sign on and refrain from shopping at the stores until they support "equal pay for equal work."

Summer 2013, Perry <u>vetoed</u> women's equal pay bill in Texas because Kroger & Macy's asked him, so to avoid law suits in state court that would be cheaper and easier than filing in federal court.

Members of **Texas Retail Merchants Assoc.** (an <u>interest group</u>) lobbied Perry for the veto, which would protect large corporations from wage discrimination law suits filed in state court that would save them huge amounts of money. 
Facts and Truth on Food Stamps:

This program is funded by Congress, but <u>each state</u>

administers it, so it is different. Republicans have cut it substantially, but increased aid to farmers. Benefits are supposed to be processed in 30days, but Texas SNAP program delayed up to 6 months (a long time when you are hungry) and was fined \$4. million a few years ago.

MYTH: People who get SNAP don't work.

FACT: The overwhelming majority of SNAP recipients who can work do work.

2. MYTH: SNAP is a drain on taxpayers.

FACT: every \$1 in SNAP benefits generates \$1.73 in economic activity.

3. MYTH: SNAP is rife with fraud and abuse.

Texans June 2013 divided on food stamp proposal

WASHINGTON — As the House of Representatives began whittling down 103 Farm Bill amendments on Wednesday, Texas lawmakers remain divided over the high-stakes, half-trillion-dollar legislation that could strip funds for food stamps.

The biggest conflict concerns the \$20.5 billion in food stamp cuts in the House bill, which Democrats attack as unfair to low-income families and Republicans defend as necessary to reduce wasteful spending.

David Gibson, a longtime lobbyist with the Texas Corn Producers Association, said the bill's future appears uncertain after House Democrats blasted the food stamp cuts this week.








For a third straight year, the number of people in the United States living in poverty has remained at 15 percent:





PERCENTAGE LIVING IN POVERTY IN 2012 BY STATE:




Where Poor and Uninsured Americans Live



MEDICAID is a federal/state program to help defray medical costs for low income people. Some of the benefits are paid by the states and <u>the states that have</u> <u>the most poor are doing the least to improve it.</u>

How Different Groups Are Affected

More than half of the nation's poor and uninsured live in states that are not participating in the expansion of Medicaid, and the share among blacks is even higher.



The Recession and technology have eliminated good paying jobs, so many people are forced into minimum wage, part-time, low-skill, and service jobs with no benefits or healthcare.



Food stamp rolls jump as more seniors struggle


At age 64, Paulette Lanius is a "Golden Boomer" — one of the 76 million American babies born after World War II, a legacy of the legions of men and women described as the Greatest Generation.

But the future for this Houston woman and thousands of other seniors appears to be far from great.

The fastest-growing group of Texans receiving food stamps is the 60-64 age bracket. In the past six years, those residents receiving food assistance — now issued in the form of a benefit debit

Program Description

Many Texans have trouble making ends meet each month. After paying for rent, utilities, transportation, and child care, there's often little left over to buy nutritious food. But it doesn't have to be that way. Each month, hundreds of thousands of families across the state turn to the Texas Department of Human Services (DHS) to receive help in the form of SNAP benefits to help feed their families. Read on to learn how you can receive help if you qualify.

SNAP is a Federally funded program that helps low-income families buy nutritious food from local food stores. SNAP assistance is available to qualifying families, elderly people, and single adults. Applicants must reside in Texas, and must apply in the county in which they reside.

Food Stamp Facts:



- Federal government wants applicants <u>certified in 30</u> <u>days, but some are waiting months</u>
- Two years ago, 2.3 million Texans depended on the food program.
- Today that number has grown to 2.8 million.
- More than 364,000 Harris County residents were on food stamps last month, about 63,000 more than in July 2007.
- □ The average Harris County family receives \$324 worth of food aid per month.
- Ratio of recipients per worker roughly 779 today.
- Food stamps offer unrestricted choice in what is purchased
- Only 50% of eligible recipient in Houston actually receive the benefits they deserve


With the lowest state food stamp participation rate in the country, local Houston grocers have become outraged over the lost revenues that are redirected to other states because Texas is so inefficient with the program administration. Feds are now finding new ways to directly certify food providers such as the Houston Food Bank. houston

- Nearly 442,000 Harris County residents are receiving food assistance this month in the form of food stamps. That is about 88,000 more than last August and worth \$56 million to area grocers. The average family gets \$323 worth of food for the month.

WIC (Women, Infants and Children) is a nutrition program that provides only the basics:

- * Healthy foods (<u>but the cheapest brand</u>) such as milk, juice, cereal, cheese, eggs, infant formula, tuna and carrots
 - * Nutrition education to improve family health
- * Breastfeeding advice and support
- * Referrals to doctors, dentists, and other community services.

As a result of the Recession, more people get less money.








