

Study of word origin and structure through the introduction of prefixes, suffixes, root words, plurals, abbreviations, and symbols; surgical procedures, medical specialties, and diagnostic procedures.

- **Social Responsibility** intercultural competence, knowledge of civic responsibility, and the ability to engage effectively in regional, national, and global communities
- **Personal Responsibility** ability to connect choices, actions and consequences to ethical decision-making

Written Assignment

Assignments are online within Canvas. Assignments close the same Sunday as the corresponding exam. No make-up assignments will be given. In the textbook, students should complete the assignments at the end of each chapter as assigned each week. These are not graded by the professor however, completion of assignments is necessary to assure course comprehension.

Exams

Exams are online within Canvas using Respondus. Exams open on Monday and close on Sunday. No make-up exams will be given.

Final Exam

All students will be required to take the online final exam on campus using Respondus. Remote students who are unable to come to campus must obtain a professor approved proctor at least 3 weeks prior to the final exam date. Failure to do so may result in the student not being able to take their final exam. No make-up final exams will be administered.
