HCC COURSE WITHDRAWAL POLICY

The State of Texas has begun to impose penalties on students who drop courses excessively. For example, if you repeat the same course more than twice, you have to pay extra tuition. Beginning in Fall 2007, the Texas Legislature passed a law limiting students to no more than **SIX** total course withdrawals **throughout** their educational career in obtaining a certificate and/or degree.

To help students avoid having to drop/withdraw from any class, HCC has instituted an Early Alert process by which your professor will "alert" you and counselors that you might fail a class because of excessive absences and/or poor academic performance. You should visit with your professor or a counselor to learn about what, if any, HCC interventions might be available to assist you – online tutoring, child care, financial aid, job placement, etc. – to stay in class and improve your academic performance.

If you plan on withdrawing from your class, you MUST contact a counselor or your professor prior to withdrawing (dropping) the class and this must be done PRIOR to the withdrawal deadline to receive a "W" on your transcript. **Final withdrawal deadlines vary each semester and/or depending on class length, please visit the online registration calendars, HCC schedule of classes and catalog, any HCC Registration Office, or any HCC counselor to determine class withdrawal deadlines. Remember to allow a 24-hour response time when communicating via email and/or telephone with a professor and/or counselor. Do not submit a request to discuss withdrawal options less than a day before the deadline. If you do not withdraw before the deadline, you will receive the grade that you are making in the class as your final grade.

EXAMS

Exams are multiple choice, true/false, matching, fill-in-the blanks, and essay. There will be approximately 14-16 exams. This will include the Mid-term exam and the Final Exam. Exams need to be taken on the date assigned via Blackboard. The Mid-term and Final Exam will be taken at the Coleman College. **There will be no Make-up Exams given.**

PRESENTATIONS

Each student will be assigned a body system (skeletal, urinary, etc). The student is to do research on their assigned topic and turn in a 2 page typed paper discussing their research. Do not turn in a presentation from the internet. This should be a paper typed in your own words. Also, a powerpoint presentation is not a typed report. All presentations must have a visual aid. Visual Aids may include posters, handouts, powerpoints, etc. The student will be required to present findings in class. Student will be graded on summary content, content of classroom presentation, articulation, eye contact, familiarity with subject matter, clarity of subject matter to audience, and visual aid. The student will need to assess the students understanding of the subject matter by administrating an exam. The exam needs to have at least 10 questions which can be multiple choice, true/false, short essay, or fill in the blanks. **Do not stand in front of the class and** just read your report. Be prepared and present your information to your classmates in your own words. Due: March 23, 2011 These presentations will be done in class at the Coleman College.

Quizzes: Student will take a quiz over the assigned chapters. These quizzes are not the exams. They will be posted via Blackboard and can be taken from Thursday thru Tuesday of each week. These quizzes may not be made up so take them as assigned.

All assignments must have a coversheet. Assignments turned in without a coversheet will result in points being deducted. The cover sheet must be centered on the sheet of paper and must include the following:
