**1.COURSE DESCRIPTION:**ESOL 0355 is a continuation of ESOL 0352. This course provides a review of both essential and finer points of the grammatical features of formal written English. Emphasis is placed on active production and error analysis of standard English.

**2.ESOL 0355 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** This course seeks to prepare students for college level academic or workforce study by accomplishing the following objectives:

- building on the syntactic knowledge that students have gained in previous study of English grammar while introducing more advanced structures as well as the finer nuances involving tense and aspect of English verbs.
- strengthening students' abilities to produce the new grammatical structures in a variety of communicative contexts.

**3.COURSE OUTCOMES:** At the end of this course, the student should be able to do the following:

- use all of the verb tenses and be able to choose between simple and progressive forms
- transform active sentences into passive sentences and vice versa
- show familiarity with the structure and use of noun clauses
- punctuate quoted and reported speech and change quoted speech to reported speech and vice versa
- recognize and use adverbial clauses correctly, including different kinds of subordinating conjunctions and proper punctuation of sentences in which they appear
- show familiarity with the main kinds of conditional sentences viewed in ESOL 0352, in addition to the use of 'wish', progressive forms, and implied conditionals.
