## Mark Making with Line

There are 2 main components and multiple steps to this homework assignment. Make sure that you complete all of the components and place them into your sketchbook before the first critique session. Please tape, glue, or staple the printed handout sheets that you complete into your sketchbook. Be sure to write you name on the sheets, too.

## Component #1

Line Mark Making Handout—there are 4 pages in this packet.

Rectangles pages: Using your 2B or B drawing pencil, **fill in** the rectangles provided using the type of line suggested beside the empty rectangle. Be sure to make the best use of the entire drawing space within each rectangle.

Circles Page: after class instruction about the different types of line, fill in the circles using the specified type of line to make the circles appear to be spheres. Use your 2B or B pencil.

## Component #2

Select ONE of the rectangles from the handout and you will enlarge and replicate the marks onto a full sheet of sketchbook paper using the following materials:

- 1. 6B pencil
- 2. Charcoal Pencil
- 3. Conté pencil (black)
- 4. Vine charcoal
- 5. Char-Kole (compressed charcoal stick)

Be sure to write on the back of the drawings the material you used and number them according to this list. You should use a 2B pencil to write on the back of your drawings.

You will turn your sketchbook in with your completed drawings in your assigned flat file drawer at the end of class on critique day. Incomplete assignments in the sketchbook will be graded as they are.

\*\* Be sure to write your name on the cover of your Sketchbook with a pen or sharpie marker. Do not use pencil or charcoal.
