Instructor's Requirements Students are required to prepare a case presentation, and participate in classroom presentations.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR CASE PRESENTATION**

Each student will present a three to five minute oral presentation summarizing a case in which they have observed or assisted. Students will be graded on use of correct dental terminology as well as the ability to answer questions. Visual aids and/or power points may be utilized in the presentation.

Each student will have an assigned date to present to the class. If you are absent on your day to present you will receive a "0".

### Program/Discipline Requirements: If applicable

Students who are absent more than 2 (two) classes may be administratively withdrawn from the course without notification.

Exams will not be accepted late. They are due by 11am on the due date.

Students will be assigned a day to present their case presentations. The case presentation will be presented at the beginning of each class. Any student who does not present his/her case presentation on his/her assigned day will receive a zero (0).
