Students will report weekly on progress of assigned simulation cases. The class will all complete the Cincinnati Seasoning Case. In addition, each student will complete one additional case involving an international supply chain.

Student Assessment(s)

There will be a final exam. No makeups will be allowed for the knowledge assessments. Assessments will be the first 30 minutes of each class. These will be short answer and handed back to you in the next class. You will use your assessments for your Final Exam.

Instructor's Requirements


