Reported cases:

<u>Gill-Massar, et al. v. Dallas County, Texas</u>, 781 S.W.2d 612 (Tex. App.-Dallas, 1989, no writ). Mr. Eaton was specially requested by three sitting State District Judges and one County Court Judge to represent their Court reporters in this case, in which the Dallas County Commissioner's Court sought to have a statute authorizing Judges to set their court reporters' salaries declared unconstitutional. After the trial court ruled against the Judges, Mr. Eaton and his co-counsel were successful in winning the appeal, setting a precedent that stands to the present time.

<u>Gulistan Carpet, Inc. v. Porter</u>, 4 S.W.3d 891 (Tex. App.- Dallas, 1999, writ ref'd.). Mr. Eaton and his co-counsel successfully defended the validity of a judgment against an out of state successor in interest to a former Texas business.

Gray & Co. Realtors v. Atlantic Housing Foundation, Inc., 228 S.W.3d 431 (Tex. App.- Dallas, 2007, no pet.). Mr. Eaton successfully defended Atlantic Housing Foundation, Inc., a large non-profit housing organization, against a suit seeking millions in real estate brokerage commissions.

<u>Neary and St. John's Holdings, Inc. v. MIKOB Properties, Inc. et al.</u> 340 S.W.3d 578 (Tex.App.-Dallas 2011, no pet.). Mr. Eaton successfully defended Comunidad Corporation, a large non-profit housing organization and several subsidiaries, against a suit seeking millions in real estate brokerage commissions and consulting fees.

Reported cases (continued):

<u>Comunidad Balboa, LLC v. City of Nassau Bay, 352 S.W.3d 72 (Tex.App.-Houston [14 Dist.] 2011).</u> Mr. Eaton successfully appealed the grant of a motion for summary judgment in a Texas

Tax Code Section 11.182 case. The case is currently on remand to the trial court for further proceedings. This reported case marks the second successfully appeal of adverse trial court action on this same matter since 2007. Mr. Eaton won a judgment for his client in this matter in a December, 2013 trial, ensuring savings of over \$2,000,000.00 in taxes.

Additional significant trial case:

Cause No. 2008-CI-10362; <u>Brompton Community Housing Development Corporation, et al. vs. the Bexar Appraisal District</u>, 45th District Court, Bexar County, Texas. In this case, tried in March, 2012, Mr. Eaton won the first known affordable housing tax exemption jury trial in Texas history. The jury returned a unanimous plaintiff's verdict in less than thirty minutes. The speedy verdict was a taxpayer rejection of the Bexar Appraisal District's war on affordable housing tax exemptions created for Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO's). These tax exemptions allow nonprofit housing organizations to provide housing and services to low and moderate income individuals and families.

Mr. Eaton was named the Texas Lawyer Litigator of the Week as a result of the victory in the Brompton case.
