Prerequisite: Department Approval

Course Goal: To write a piece of music. (First in manuscript form and later in a computer program) The composition will demonstrate compositional skills such as: motivic and rhythmical development, correct notation, idiomatic writing for instruments or voice, and will result in a performance ready score.

Required Text: None. Study scores will be provided as needed.

Attendance is Mandatory! School policy states that a student who misses more than 12.5 % of class may be dropped from the class with a W or a grade of F. Students who miss more than two classes during the semester are subject to this policy. If you have a problem in regards to class attendance please inform the instructor.
