TEACHING PHILOSOPHY

 - The history of the photographic medium
 - Business issues related to photography
 - Digital presentation and manipulation techniques
 - o The exploration of photographic imagery as a means of personal expression



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- 2. Course Design updating and redesigning existing courses for changing markets and developing new courses for the department, including:
 - History of Photography, an historical survey of the technical and aesthetic development of photography, taught as an Internet course
 - Photographic Studio Management, an introduction to business principles as they relate to photography, both taught as Internet courses
 - o Portraiture 1 and 2, dealing primarily with studio and location portraiture, as a hybrid course (using both Internet and traditional lab facilities)
 - Landscape Photography, introduction to the landscape as a subject, including exploration of historic, geographical, and cultural locations, and review of landscape photographers
- 3. Support duties helping to maintain the department as a whole, including:
 - Redevelopment of curriculum through the auspices of the Photographic Advisory Board Committee
 - o Curriculum alignment with Workforce Education Course Manual (WECM)
 - Decisions on specific equipment purchases for the department, specifically geared toward changing markets and digital pathways
 - Training and instruction of other instructors interested in online learning, both in the Distance Education Department and as a tool for hybrid courses
 - Developing aids for instructors teaching online courses, specifically geared toward problems encountered when using e-learning systems
 - Overseeing and organizing photographic exhibits for the department, either of student work or from outside sources
