




Put your name on the back of your block or plate.









Get a sponge wet. Squeeze it out. Make it pliable, not drippy.







Apply a thin layer of yellow, white (or other light color) tempera or acrylic paint to the working surface.











Trace the back of the image through the photocopy with a pencil.







Reinforce the lines of the tracing.





Trim it. Position it. Tape it to the linoblock.























Transfer finished.














Here is the inside of the linocutter handle.












Insert the blunt end of a cutter nib into the collar, between the two pieces of the bullet-thingy.

If linoleum blocks are warmed, they cut more easily. Some printers prefer a warmed block.






