E-reader articles:

The Electronic Reader or *E-reader* is a Houston Community College History Department assigned collection of primary sources, documents and articles on the area of U.S. History being covered in this course and are a **mandatory** part of the course curriculum.

For this course 10 articles will be assigned.

- > Article summaries are 10% percent of your semester grade.
- ➤ In this course, students will be tested in **two** ways on the articles.
- > Students will write a 1-2 page analysis or summary on **each** of the 10 articles.
- > Students will be expected to analyze the content of the article, the author's thesis, use of sources in making her/his/their point and finally the student will place the author's work in the context of the relevant course topic.
- > **NOTE:** Article summaries not submitted by the due date will result in the loss of credit for the relevant article assignments. **1% of the semester grade** for each article summary.
- Late article summaries will not be accepted <u>under any</u> <u>circumstances</u>. Article summaries are divided into two groups (chronologically) of five each for purposes of submission. Note the due date for each group of five summaries in the Course Calendar.
- > Students **may** will also be tested on the relevant primary sources, documents and articles in the course examinations, either as part of the *short* essay *or long* essay questions.
- ➤ If articles/documents/primary sources are to be tested on the examinations then they will be specified in the examination reviews.

Formatting requirements:

- ➤ You must use: 1-inch margins/double-spaced/size 12 Garamond/Times

 New Roman font.
- > You must use **only** one of the two fonts.
- > You will be uploading the article summaries **individually** to *turnitin.com* to **individualized folders**, therefore consider the following instructions for **each summary individually.**
- > "Cover pages" or "bibliography" pages **are not accepted** and will be penalized.
- > Print **only** the following information in the "header" section (or first line) on the first page of **each** of your article summaries in one line; your name (1), student identification number (2), title of or paper number (3);

Example: (1) Student Janet Smith (2) ID# 19141918 (3) The failure of Reconstruction

- > Students **must turn in both a hard copy in class & a soft copy** (Microsoft word document/PDF document), the soft copy is to be **uploaded** to an assigned folder on *turnitin.com*.
- > Both are required for the assignments to be considered as being completed.
