First Examination Review

Course Examination preparation guidelines:

The **primary preparation** for the examination should be based on the class course lectures and **secondary preparations** based on your readings from the main course textbook and articles (if assigned specifically).

Examination Format: The examination will be **all – essay**, with **three sections**; an **identification section**, **short – essay section** and a **long – essay section**.

- > Students will have **four to five choices** for the **identification section**, and choose **three of their choice**, **four to five choices** in the **short – essay section** and choose any **three of their choice**; in the long essay section students will have **two to three choices** and choose **one of their choice**.
- ➤ **Required for completion**: **3** short-identification questions, **3** short-essay questions, **1** long-essay question.
- > 3 short-identifications (**15 points**), 3 short-essay questions **(45 points**), 1 long-essay (**40 points**) = **100 points**
- ➤ There will be an **optional bonus** credit question section of **20 points**.
- > Each individual question in each **required** sections will have its own recommended minimum requirement.
