Rebirth of Political Parties

The Panic of 1819

- The Era of Good Feelings marred by the Panic of 1819:
- A financial crisis, unemployment, banks fail, mortgages foreclosed
- Society for the Prevention of Pauperism
- Consequences: public protest, call for 'stay laws', higher tariffs needed by manufacturing interests but Southerners believe that tariffs reduced the flow of international trade and caused problems for the South.

The Missouri Crisis

- James Tallmadge of New York
- Restrict slavery in Missouri as condition for statehood
- The Compromise: Missouri admitted as slave state and Maine as free state
- But no more slave states from the Louisiana Purchase north 36 ° 30'.
- South pays heavy price for its victory, only Arkansas will emerge as slave state.

Vesey Conspiracy of 1822

- Denmark Vesey; literate & well-traveled
- 1821: Charleston begins closing down independent African Churches
- Angers Vesey
- Inspired by French & Haitian Revolutions
- Rollah Bennet, Gullah Jack Pritchard
- Pan- African alliance
- Uprising betrayed
- Era of Good Feelings ends on note of foreboding.
